



Year 11 Destinations 2016:

This chart compares the 2016 Year 11 cohort to the previous year:

Out of the 9 who went to other sixth forms: 3 where in county, 1 went to a private school and the rest were out of County.

Of these one student has moved to a School in Swindon to do 'A' levels alongside training in ice hockey for a Swindon Club, as he hopes to become a professional, and another has moved to Northwich. Another students has moved specifically to study Italian at A level.

We have had one of the Year 11 students from last year, who left to go to another sixth form and has returned to CNS sixth form this year.

Of the 75 who went to college 23 enrolled on a level 3 courses, 25 on level 2, 25 on level 1 and 2 on Pathways.

This year there was an increase in the number of students who gained apprenticeships straight from school (11).

This year we only had 2 students in the 'other' category. One of these is NEET and the other student moved to Holland. The NEET (not in education, employment or training) was offered a college place and employment but could not make the transition to college or employment this year and has been referred to the Witney Hub for support.

PPG

Of the 22 PPG students in the Year 11 cohort 5 (23%) went into the sixth form, 13 (59%) went to college, 3 (14%) found apprenticeships and 1 (4%) was NEET. This was a far lower proportion than the rest of the cohort moving into the sixth form and far higher going to college. But many of the group were level 1 students (D-G GCSE's) so a college course the preferred option. A far higher percentage of PPG students gained employment which was excellent.

Year 12 Destinations:

Of 107 students in Year 12, 87 moved into Year 13 and 2 are repeating Year 12 (this number was far lower than the year before). Sixteen students decided to leave at the end of Year 12 and go to college to study a range of courses including, media, sport, health & social care, childcare, forensic science, animal management and art and design. Two students went into employment, one secured an apprenticeship with BMW and the other student is working at Argos.

PPG

Of the 8 PPG students in Year 12 all secured grades in their AS exams to enable them to move into Year 13.
