Homework

We know that homework has the potential to be of huge value and importance, but also a headache for students, parents, carers and teachers. This is why we our trying to raise our own game as teachers so that we all use Show My Homework really successfully.

Mr Gent (Assistant Headteacher) recently led some training with all teaching staff. He set out some principles that we are all expected to apply so that your children always receive very clear and very precise instructions. We expect there to be more preparation or practice as part of their homework.

We can see how quickly and enthusiastically almost all students are when we provide very well designed homework activities. For example, we shouldn't be using vague terms like 'practise', 'revise' or 'research' without making clear our expectations of how a topic might be learnt, practised, revised or researched. Students should always be clear on volume (a two-page essay, at least ten flashcards, a brief summary), process (the steps to success, what to read when researching) and how they will be held to account (what they have to hand in). Wherever possible, we will provide scaffolds and support and signpost where help might be found.
