Government Updates on GCSE and A-level Grades

Just as the Year 11s were having their final assembly with Mrs Jackson, further details on exams and grades were announced by the Department for Education. <u>The document</u> is there to be read but the key message appears to be, "The exam boards will be asking teachers, who know their students well, to submit their judgement about the grade that they believe the student would have received if exams had gone ahead."

This describes a process that most schools anticipated. It would appear logical to assume that the work completed by Year 11 and 13 students between now and the point that teachers are asked to submit that data should, and will, influence and edge-up those grades. In other words, every little bit of work that Year 11 and Year 13 students complete at home will help improve their final grades. I can assure you that we would not urge this if we did not believe this to be true.

CNS Learning Hub

Everything is now ready to welcome in those students who are the children of key workers. In order to fight the COVID-19 outbreak we shall remain open every day so that these parents and carers can keep the country moving and get us all back to full health.

The Government extended <u>the list of key worker occupations</u> this morning.
