## Health warning



When you either listen to or watch programmes or videos in the language, you will probably be filled with fright at first and think 'how on earth am I supposed to understand what is being said?' This is a totally natural response. It is extremely unlikely that, at GCSE level, you will have to cope with the German language spoken at native-speaker speed, but immersing yourself in the language will enable you to gain the skills of picking out words and phrases. It is a gradual business and, therefore, should be started as soon as possible and not left until the dark hours two days before your listening exam. It is all a case of developing your awareness of the language, how it goes together, how it sounds, and how it is used. It might even be said that listening to songs can be especially useful since, as well as giving you the chance to listen, you will subconsciously find yourself singing along as you get used to the rhythm of each song.

If you do listen to German music and watch German TV and films, you will develop a very good knowledge of how good German usage sounds – not just what is linguistically correct, but what sounds 'German', and this will serve you very well for the speaking components.
