

When is a shoe not a shoe?

Families and students will be aware that since September 2019 much clearer rules on correct footwear have been enforced at CNS. The rules are clear:

- Plain black leather / synthetic leather type shoes that offer basic protection in wet weather. The shoe must cover the foot and therefore offer basic protection against falling objects or liquids in practical lessons.
- No trainers, boots, pumps, ballet style slip-ons, plimsolls, daps, sling-backs or canvas footwear
- No visible branding or logos
- Laces must be black (although Velcro and discreet buckles are permitted)
- No heels over 3cm

In order to further assist families make the correct purchases the following images are provided as a guide.

Shoes ought to be smart and comfortable. They must have some basic protection against rain and puddles. Plus, they are not designed for sporting activities.
