We expect Mr Jarvis to be back with us next year as a trainee teacher and wish him well as he enters the profession after much encouragement from those who have always admired his dedication to and manner with the students!

Mr Bryant, school counsellor, will now retire after many years of dedicated service. Mr Lutman, our volunteer counsellor, will also be leaving us this summer. Both will always be remembered for their great care for our students. In September, we shall review our provision in this area and consider the immediate and longer term needs of our students following this period of school closure.

Mrs Brown (Food Technology) will also be greatly missed by us all and the Design & Technology team in particular. Finally, Mrs Eden, our morning receptionist, will also be leaving CNS this summer for pastures new and we thank her for all her work over many years.
