## Mass Testing Programme Update

In <u>my letter to you last Friday</u>, I set out details about the mass testing programme and invited families, sixth formers and colleagues to provide consent to be tested.

Even though the date of our reopening is not yet known, it will be helpful to secure those consent forms as soon as possible (acknowledging that consent may be withdrawn at any time). You will also be aware of further decisions made by the Department for Education regarding lateral flow testing, earlier this week. In summary:

- We shall continue testing all staff on site twice each week for the foreseeable future.
- All students who are still in school will be tested twice, 3 to 4 days apart, but will not be asked to undergo weekly tests thereafter.
- In addition, all (consenting) students (and staff) will be tested twice (3-4 days apart) when they return to school.

## **Summer 2021 National Consultation**

The national consultation is underway regarding the cancelled summer 2021 examinations.
