Chipping Norton School is pleased to report some outstanding achievements by its students in their A levels and other qualifications this summer.

For example, half of all grades were A*/A, with three quarters secured at A*/B. More importantly, close to 90% of our students achieved or exceeded their ambitious target grades.

Our students are now preparing for life beyond CNS at a range of very competitive courses, top universities and degree apprenticeships. This includes Catriona McCleery - who will be reading Natural Sciences at Cambridge, and Charlie Summers – who will also be heading off to Cambridge, to study History & Foreign Languages.

This year, following the cancellation of exams, grades were awarded through a process of teacher assessed grades, against a national standard and approved and awarded by the exam boards. The government is not publishing performance data for any schools or colleges this year due to the varying impact of the pandemic.

The school's headteacher, Barry Doherty, said: "It has been a privilege to teach and support the latest generation to leave our Outstanding sixth form, and begin new adventures all over the United Kingdom. Particularly after such a difficult and disrupted year, we are immensely proud of all the work and achievements of our students.
