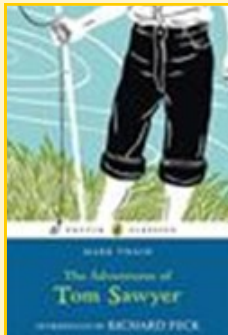
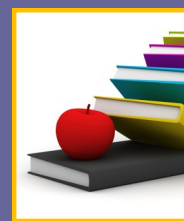

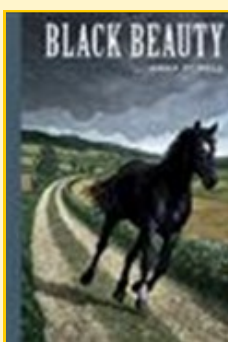
THE JUNGLE BOOK

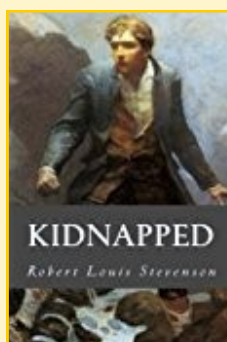


BLACK BEAUTY

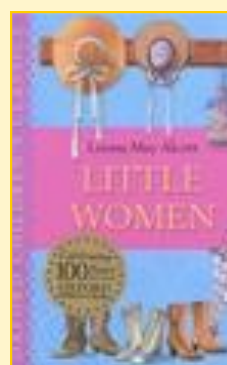


THE CALL OF THE WILD

KING SOLOMON'S MINES

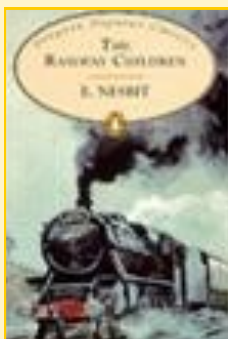
H. Rider Haggard

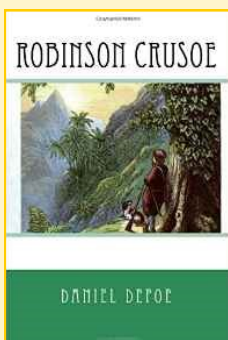


TREASURE ISLAND

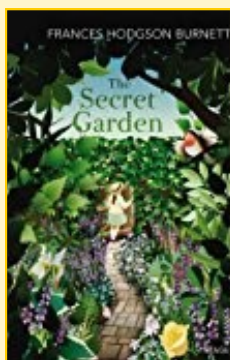


WHAT KATY DID

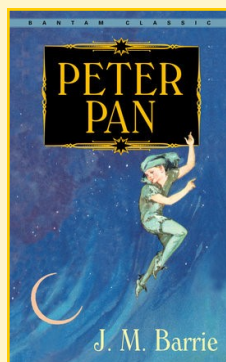


THE SECRET GARDEN

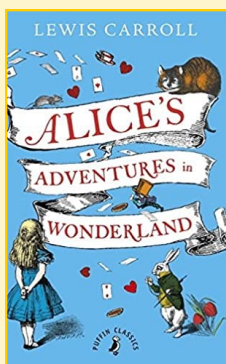


THE SWISS FAMILY ROBINSON
